The Minutes of the VI Meeting of the Academic Council held on Saturday, the 7th July, 2018 at 10.40 am in the Board Room of MITS with the Principal Dr C Yuvaraj in the chair.

The Member Secretary welcomed all the members and introduced them to each other.

The Chairman presided over the meeting. At the outset, he presented the following brief report on the achievements of MITS during the academic year 2017-18:

- MoUs with Ming Chi University Taipei and Asia University Taichung in Taiwan on Student and Faculty exchange.
- Entered into EPICS Experimental Physics and Industrial Control Systems Program of Purdue University with the objective of creating opportunities to the students to develop solid expertise in the technical areas.
- 3. MoUs with Roger Williams University, Bristol, Rhode Island, USA and North-Eastern University Boston, USA are in process.
- 4. MoUs with Care Business Solutions Pvt. Ltd, Red Hat India Pvt. Ltd. & Blend Steel Engineering Pvt. Ltd with clear focus to make our students Industry ready.
- 5. Identified as CM's Center of Excellence during this academic year to facilitate specialized training for the benefit of different branches.
- 6. 1871 students trained in various technical courses under APSSDC.
- 7. Placements: 745 students placed through 93 campus drives during 2017-18
- 8. One of the 25 Centers of Excellence in India under the aegis of APSSDC for Artificial Intelligence & Deep Learning by Bennett University, Noida in collaboration with Brunel University, London.
- Started employability oriented training to Mechanical Engineering Students through Dessault Systems Center of Excellence with support from APSSDC.

The council appreciated the institute's enormous achievements during 2017-18, particularly the progress made in number of placements, internships, projects etc.

Thereafter, the agenda items were taken up for discussion.

Agenda item No.1: Inclusion of MOOCs offered under SWAYAM:

With reference to the Gazette of India Part III – Section 4 dated 22 August 2016, it was accepted to include the MOOCs offered by SWAYAM in the existing MOOC list under R14 Academic Regulations.

Agenda item No.2: Ratification of II, III & IV year Syllabi of B. Tech Programmes - Computer Science & Information Technology (CSIT) and Information Technology (IT) - R14 Academic Regulations

The syllabi of the above programmes were discussed and approved as laid on the table.

Agenda item No.3: Ratification of Academic Regulations – R18, Course Structures and Syllabi of B. Tech programmes: Civil Engineering, Electrical & Electronics Engineering, Electronics & Communications Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Computer Science & Engineering, Computer Science & Information Technology & Computer Science & Technology (New Programme)

The Academic Regulations – R18 for all B. Tech programmes, and their course structures were discussed and approved as laid on the table with the following modifications regarding promotion rules:

A student shall be promoted from II to III year only if he/she acquires 40% of the credits from the courses that have been studied up to II year I semester from the following examinations, irrespective of whether the candidate takes the end semester examination or not as per the normal course of study.

- a. One regular and two supplementary examinations of I Year I Semester.
- b. One regular and one supplementary examinations of I Year II Semester.
- c. One regular examination of II year I semester

A student shall be promoted from III to IV year only if he/she acquires 40% of the credits from the courses that have been studied up to III year I semester from the following examinations, irrespective of whether the candidate takes the end semester examination or not as per the normal course of study.

- a. One regular and four supplementary examinations of I year I semester.
- b. One regular and three supplementary examinations of I year II semester.
- c. One regular and two supplementary examinations of II year I semester.
- d. One regular and one supplementary examinations of II year II semester.
- e. One regular examination of III year I semester.

The Syllabus of I Year B.Tech was discussed in detail and approved by the committee.

Agenda item No.4: Ratification of Academic Regulations – R18, Course Structures and Syllabi of M.Tech programmes: Structural Engineering, Electrical Power Systems, Advanced Manufacturing Systems, Digital Electronics & Communication Systems and Computer Science & Engineering.

The Academic Regulations - R18 for all M.Tech programmes, their course structures and the syllabi were discussed and approved as laid on the table.

Agenda item No.5: Ratification of Academic Regulations - R18, Course Structure and Syllabus of MBA programme

The Course Structure, Syllabus and each item in the Academic Regulations are discussed and resolved as laid on the table.

Agenda item No.6: Ratification of Academic Regulations – R18, Course Structures and Syllabi of MCA (Three year programme) & MCA (Two year programme)

The Course Structure, Syllabus and each item in the Academic Regulations are discussed and resolved as laid on the table.

The distribution of marks for P.G. Programmes i.e., M.Tech, MBA, MCA (three year programme) & MCA (two-year program) under R-18 Academic regulations shall be evaluated course wise, with a maximum of 100 marks for Theory / Practice, on the basis of Internal Evaluation and End Semester Examination. For the theory/practical courses 40 marks are allotted for internal evaluation (There shall be two Mid-term tests of 30 marks each & 10 marks for two Assignments-5 marks each) and 60 marks for End Semester Examination.

However, the students who are admitted to II year MCA (three year programme) under Lateral entry during 2018-19 shall be offered the same number of credits and courses as applicable for II & III year MCA, under R-16 Academic Regulations.

Agenda item No.7: Student High Action Research Program—SHARP

The Council hailed the launch of **Student High Action Research Program—SHARP** with a budget of Rs. 60 Lakh, to pay Stipend of Rs.1000/- per month for 600 students from 1st year to 3rd year towards Research work. However, it was advised to exclude I year students, as it was felt too early for them.

Agenda item No.8: Any other matter with permission of the Chair

a. Inclusion of a virtual lab in III year BTech, without credits, is accepted.

The following suggestions / proposals were made for implementation in due course of time:

- a. To send the faculty having projects to Asia University, Taiwan for getting trained in patenting, thereby develop research collaborations and design activities. Also to send M Tech students during their project work.
- b. To attract students with foreign nationality and thereby establish diversity among students.
- c. To get all the approvals from state govt. and the university towards the admission of students from Nepal.
- d. To create vacancies for full-time PhD scholars which also fulfills a requirement for NIRF.
- e. To create group e-mail IDs of all the external members and mail any achievements / information of the institute.
- f. To conduct AC Meetings twice a year.
- g. To inform the progress made regarding EPIC & SHARP.

The meeting was concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by the Member Secretary.

STUDENT HIGH ACTION RESEARCH PROGRAM: SHARP

Preamble: To promote active student involvement in research activities from early stages of their undergraduate program by working with faculty on specific/focused research, MITS is proposing a "Student High Action Research Program" through a SHARP Fellowship to meritorious students desirous of working with faculty in research, publications and projects.

Broad Guidelines:

- 1. 200 students each from 1st, 2nd and 3rd years will be selected based on their interest and academic performance.
- 2. 600 SHARP Fellowship will be provided to 1st, 2nd and 3rd year students.
- 3. Selected students will receive a stipend of Rs. 1000/- per month for a period of 10 months, spread over 5 months in each semester.
- 4. One student from 1st year, one from 2nd year and one student from 3rd year will be attached with a faculty member and they will have to work with the faculty on specific research topics by contributing a minimum of 10 hours a week, besides their regular class
- 5. Students are expected to get trained by the faculty in their respective areas of research.
- 6. Performance will be monitored on a monthly basis to assess progress of the student.
- 7. Goals and Objectives with clear timelines have to be agreed upon by both the faculty and students before the start of the object.
 - 1. Specific outcome of the work has to be mentioned by the research team before commencement of the work.
 - 2. A contingency grant of Rs 10,000/- will be provided to such faculty to meet expenses related to the work and expenses report will be submitted at the end of 1st year.
- 8. A minimum of 1 conference paper and 1 journal publication (in SCI/SCOPUS journals) are mandatory expectations at the end of the 1st year.
- 9. Review will be done every month by Departmental Research Committee on the progress. 10. Exit policy:
 - 1. If student leaves, in between the year :
 - 1. If there is no tangible outcome during the Fellowship period and the Student wants to withdraw from the SHARP Fellowship then such student will be required to return the amount so received.
 - 2. Those who couldn't get selected in the first 200 but are within the first 250 of 1st year or 2nd year and 3rd year as the case may be can be taken as "bench" candidates and replacement will be provided.
 - 3. If bench students are not available, fresh notice will be issued inviting applications for providing Fellowship.
 - 2. If faculty leaves, student to be assigned to another faculty. MITS will try its best to match the area, but if not possible, student has a choice to decide whether to continue under the SHARP Fellowship program.
 - 3. Apex Research committee will decide on such case on case to case basis.
- 11. Travel grant as well as, boarding and lodging shall be met from the contingency grant if
- 12. Faculty to update Apex Research committee of any "slip" in commitments from the students immediately. For this, faculty can give 2 chances to the student before raising

The above points were discussed, and the following conclusions were made:

- 1. The Committee has decided to include the unpaid Clause, if not included in the earlier version.
- 2. The Committee has not recommended Dr.Anil Soni's Publication i.e., Lock-in Amplifier Based Eddy Current Instrument for Detection of Sub-surface Defect in Stainless Steel Plates" as the affiliation is not correct.
- 3. The Committee has recommended to consider incentives for publications which are eligible but got missed during previous release of incentives due to miscommunication. Faculty to submit proof/s along with a request in writing stating to reconsider their publications for incentive in the next round.
- 4. The Committee has suggested to include a Clause in Circular-63 which states "The publication will be considered for incentives, if it is submitted to R&D on or before the stipulated deadline."
- 5. The Committee has ratified the equipment's (6) purchased in different DST projects from 03.01.2019, to till date.

6. The Committee proposed to recruit Lab Assistants for each lab on permanent basis to takecare of costly research equipment being purchased under project grants.

The Committee has decided not to approve any OD for faculty attending evaluation, as Ph. D examiners and O.D will be issued to the faculty who are going on institute related work only.

8. The faculty who own a research Project can avail a maximum of 5 O.D per project per year and for extra O.D, the faculty has to get approval from the Committee.

9. To run the MITS Drone project smoothly, a monthly budget of Rs 10,000/-(maximum) was requested. However, it was stated that typical budget would not exceed Rs 2,000/- towards purchase of electronic components. Committee has approved the budget which can used from R&D Misc. account.

10. All the Patents should be filed with Institute name "Madanapalle Institute of Technology & Science" which should be the Owner and Assignee of the funded patent. R&D is in consultation with external patent filing agencies seeking quotations for the services to be rendered in this regard.

11. As most of the PI's of Sponsored research Projects are facing difficulties in executing the project, the Committee has recommended to recruit the JRF shortly.

12. The Committee has decided to pay 2% as the project incentives for the existing projects, out of which the PI and Co-PI will get 80:20 share, subject to the approval of Management.

13. The Committee has recommended to update the webpage on Benefits with respect to Projects to "as per the norms of the college". Currently, the content is as given below:

Incentive will be paid to the team of investigators of research projects with external funding in an amount equal to 10% of the total project funding. This incentive will be paid in two parts - 5% after receipt of the 70% of the project amount and the other 5% on completion of the project and receipt of the balance amount of the project. The incentive amount is divided equally among all the investigators.
